Have had vandalism done to the splash pad bathrooms, and grove park in the last couple weeks. 3-year Lead and Copper testing was done with no high levels being detected.

Pam Hagerman, City Administrator reported that she is currently looking into the possibility of switching IT support. Tom recommended that the Finance Committee look over the proposed IT support quotes. She passed along the final draft of what the new City signs will look like. Will need to get this project going to get done before winter hits.

Dave Gage reported that the transfer switches have been installed at City Hall for the anticipation for the new generator in January.
