## ORDINANCE NUMBER FORTY-THREE

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT RIOTS IN THE CITY OF CARSON CITY, MICHIGAN THE CITY OF CARSON CITY ORDAINS:

SECTION I. RIOT. It is unlawful and constitues the offense of riot for five (5) or more persons, acting in concert, to wrongfully engage in violent conduct and thereby intentionally or recklessly cause or create a serious risk of causing public terror or alarm.

SECTION II. SEPARABILITY. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

SECTION III. ORDINANCES REPEALED. All ordinances and/or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION IV. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 15 days from and after its enactment as provided by the City Charter.
