ORDINANCE NUMBER FORTY-FOUR

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT THE INCITEMENT TO RIOT WITHIN THE CITY OF CARSON CITY, MICHIGAN

THE CITY OF CARSON CITY ORDAINS:

SECTION I. INCITEMENT TO RIOT. It is unlawful and constitues incitement to riot for a person or persons, intending to cause or to aid or abet the institution or maintenance of a riot, to do an act or engage in conduct that urges other persons to commit acts of unlawful force or violence, or the unlawful burning or destroying of property, or the unlawful interference with a police officer, peace officer, fireman or a member of the Michigan National Guard or any unit of the armed services officially assigned to riot duty in the lawful performance of his duty.

SECTION II. SEPARABILITY. If any section, subsection, paragraph sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

SECTION II. ORDINANCES REPEALED. All ordinances and/or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION III. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 15 days from and after its enactment as provided by the City Charter.
